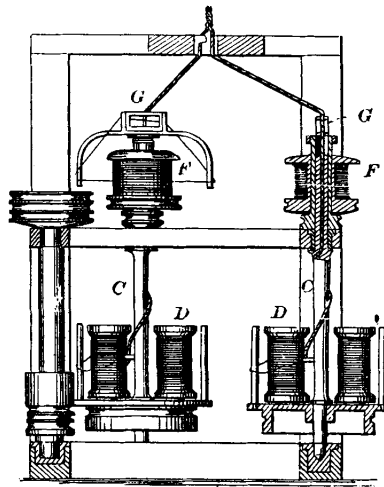

which a cord (or wire) receives a covering of thread or silk ; when this is plaited on, it constitutes braiding. (See BRAIDING-MACHINE.) In the machine represented, the yarn-bobbins *D D* are upon carriers, and the yarn proceeds upwardly through the spindles *C* and the flyer-bobbins *F*, which are sleeved thereon and carry the silk, which is twisted by the flyer around the yarn or cord from the spool *D* at a point below where it issues from the guide *G*. At a point above, the three covered yarns are twisted into a threefold cord or bullion.
