



Hackling-Machine.

This separates the ribbons of fiber, removes any re-naining traces of the *boon* or cellular matter, and divides the fiber into two portions, the *short* and the long, the tow and the line.

The process is repeated on a fine hackle whose teeth are more numerous and thickly set. The produce is from 40 to 60 per cent of fine flax; line.
