

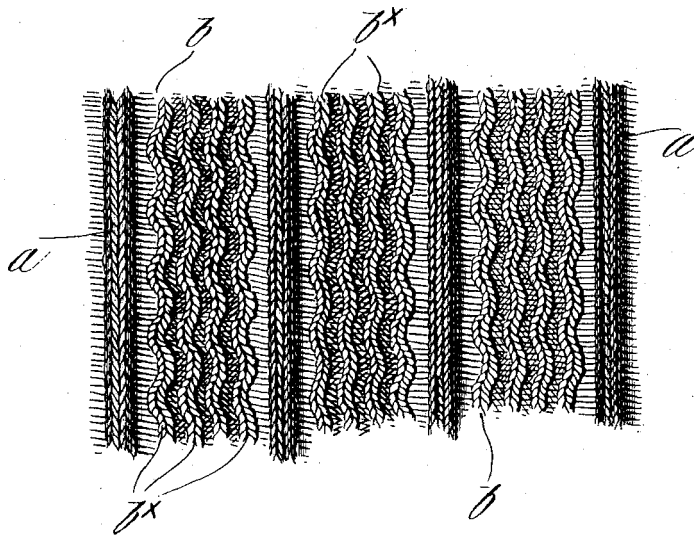

DESIGN FOR FABRIC.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 36,209, dated January 27, 1903.

Application filed December 24, 1902. Serial No. 136,501. Term of patent 7 years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, WALTER A. O'BRIEN, a citizen of the United States, and a resident of Boston, county of Suffolk, State of Massachusetts, have invented a new, original, and ornamental Design for a Fabric, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, forming part hereof.

10 The drawing represents a face view of a portion of the fabric illustrating my design.

15 The leading feature of my design consists in a series of parallel and relatively large rope-like wales laterally separated by broad bands of fabric, each of which is ornamented by a series of relatively small serpentine or sinuous ribs parallel to each other and extending in the direction of the length of the large rope-like wales.

In the drawing the relatively large rope- 20 like wales *a* are laterally separated by broad bands *b* of fabric, each band being ornamented by a series of relatively small sinuous or serpentine ribs *b*^x, parallel to each other and extending in the direction of the length of the 25 large wales *a*, the outermost ribs of each band being slightly separated from the adjacent wales.

I claim—

The ornamental design for a fabric substan- 30 tially as herein shown and described.
